# **Group Presentation**

# Purpose

This assignment aims to explore the diverse cultural, historical, linguistic, and religious landscapes of the former Yugoslav republics. Each group will delve into a specific republic, creating a rich multimedia presentation using VoiceThread that showcases their comprehensive research.

# Task

### **Group Formation and Republic Assignment**

The class will be divided into six groups, with each group assigned to research one of the following Yugoslav republics:

- 1. Bosnia and Herzegovina
- 2. Croatia
- 3. Macedonia
- 4. Montenegro
- 5. Serbia
- 6. Slovenia

### Research Areas

Each group member will choose one of the following topics to focus their research on, contributing this information to the group's overall presentation:

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- History: Major historical events and their impact on the republic and its people.
- · Cuisine: Traditional dishes and their cultural significance.
- · Culture: Arts, music, holidays, and other cultural expressions.
- · Religion: The role of religion in society and how it influences daily life.
- Language: Overview of the language(s) spoken and any linguistic issues or interesting facts.

### VoiceThread Presentation Creation

- Media Compilation: Each group will gather images, videos, documents, and other relevant media illustrating their research.
- VoiceThread Setup: Using VoiceThread, each group will create an interactive presentation that includes:
  - Slides for Each Topic: Separate slides dedicated to history, cuisine, culture, religion, and language.
  - Narrative and Analysis: Each group member will narrate their slides, providing insights and analysis on their topic.
  - Engagement Features: Encourage class interaction by posing questions or providing prompts on different slides to facilitate discussion.

### Presentation

- Live Presentation: Each group will present their VoiceThread to the class. This should include a walkthrough of the slides with real-time narration.
- **Discussion and Feedback**: After each presentation, the class will have the opportunity to ask questions and provide feedback through VoiceThread's comment feature.

### **Technical Requirments**

- VoiceThread Account: Each student must have access to VoiceThread. Group members should collaborate
  within the same project to ensure continuity.
- · Hardware Requirements:
  - Computer: Reliable access to a computer with internet connectivity is required.
  - Microphone: Use a good quality microphone for recording clear audio for your narrations.
  - Headphones: Recommended for better audio playback during editing.
- · Software and Tools:
  - VoiceThread: For creating and managing the presentation. Familiarize yourself with adding and editing slides, audio, and comments.
  - Image and Video Editing Software (optional but recommended):
    - Adobe Photoshop: For editing images.
    - Adobe Premiere or iMovie: For editing video clips before uploading them to VoiceThread.
  - Audio Editing Software (optional):

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- Audacity: For enhancing audio clarity and removing background noise.
- · Supported Media Formats:
  - Ensure all images, videos, and audio files are compatible with VoiceThread requirements.
- Internet Connectivity: A stable and high-speed internet connection is required for uploading multimedia content and presenting live.
